Mwene Nzinga Mbandi (1582-17 December 1663) or Ana de Sousa, was the reigning queen (Angola) of the Kingdom of Ndongo between 1624 to 1626 and founder and queen of the Kingdom of Matamba, recognized by Portugal as Ana I from 1631 until her death in 1663.
