2023 Attitude Survey of Setagaya Residents (Summary)

The Attitude Survey of Setagaya Residents (Summary) is the summary of the 2023 Attitude Survey of Setagaya Residents conducted in May 2023 and has been prepared so that a wider range of city

residents may be informed about it.

This year's survey included topics for understanding changes that occur over time such as "Intention of Permanent Residence" and "Reception of City Staff," and in addition to these, ones regarding "Setagaya City General Plan", "Residents' Exchange Space", and "SETAGAYA Pay".

The results of the survey are used as basic data for carrying out the mission of the city government.













Intention of permanent residence




• Difficulties faced in day-to-day life in the area (multiple responses)






• Achievement of the "Nine Visions" of the "Setagaya City General Plan"

50.2% said "I feel this is being realized" (total of those answering "Yes, I feel this is being realized" and "I feel this is being slightly realized") for "Create a more livable city that is pleasant and enjoyable for walks", followed by "Ensure a foundation that allows residents to live in a state of feeling healthy and secure" (45.2%), "Create a community that is environmentally friendly" (44.2%), etc. On the other hand, 57.9% said "I feel this is not being realized" (total of those answering "I feel this is not being realized much" and "I feel this is not being realized") for "Make it easier for more residents to participate in city administration and public activities".






Awareness of Welfare Hotlines

When respondents were asked if they were aware of the Welfare Hotlines provided by the City for receiving consultation inquiries, 18.0% of them said "I have used them", 28.2% "I have heard of them", and 9.7% "Although I did not know what they were called, I was aware of such efforts"; thus 55.9% of respondents were aware of the Welfare Hotlines, while 43.3% said "I do not know".




Awareness of in-home medical care

Asked how aware respondents were of in-home medical care, 11.8% of them said "I use it for myself, or a person close to me does", 23.7% "I have heard of the program (and understand the difference between house calls and in-home medical care) but have not used it" and 36.8% "I have heard of the program (but do not understand the difference between house calls and in-home medical care) but have not used it", giving the total of 72.4% knew about it. 26.7% said they did not know about it.



Awareness of ACP (Advance Care Planning)


Asked how aware respondents were of ACP (Advanced Care Planning), 4.6% of them said "I know about ACP and I have discussed it with medical/nursing care professionals and/or people around me" and 10.7% "I know about ACP but I have never discussed it with medical/nursing care professionals and/or people around me", giving the total of 15.3% knew about it. 15.5% said "I do not know the term "ACP" but I have discussed it with medical/nursing care professionals and/or people around me" and 68.1% "I have never heard of ACP and I have never discussed it with medical/nursing care professionals and/or people around me", giving the total of 83.6% said they did not know about it.

Awareness of the "Setagaya City Hope Ordinance on Coexistence with People with Dementia"


Asked how aware respondents were of the "Setagaya City Hope Ordinance on Coexistence with People with Dementia", 1.9% of them replied "I know what it contains" and 8.6% "I have heard of it, but I do not really know what it contains", giving the total of 10.5% knew about it. 88.6% replied "I do not know anything about it".


Asked how aware respondents were that sign language is a unique language, 11.0% of them replied "Yes, I know this well" and 49.8% "Yes, I know this to a certain extent", giving the total of 60.8% knew about it. 37.8% replied "I do not know".

Child raising environment in Setagaya City


When asked about the child-rearing environment in Setagaya City, 5.8% of people replied "I feel that the town is extremely parenting-friendly", and 43.6% "I feel that the town is parenting-friendly" giving the total of 49.4% said "I feel that the town is parenting-friendly". 12.9% of them replied "I don't think that the town is very parenting-friendly" and 1.1% "I don't think that the town is parenting-friendly at all", giving the total of 14.1% said "I don't think that the town is parenting-friendly".


When asked whether respondents were participating in local community activities, 17.1% of them replied "I do participate" and 16.9% "I do not participate now, but I would like to in the future", giving the total of 34.0% said "I do participate or I would like to in the future". 64.9% of them replied "I do not participate".

Expectation from the Residents' Exchange Space (multiple responses)


When asked what respondents expect for the Residents' Exchange Space, the highest response was 46.1% for "Create a space where residents can casually chat, rest, or eat/drink, etc.", followed by "Improve opportunities to experience culture/art (lobby concerts, etc.)", "Improve evets such as exhibitions, workshops, and markets", "Improve opportunities for participating in exchange among residents", etc.



11. Disaster Preparations


Awareness of sheltering-at-home recommendations

Asked how aware respondents were of the City of Setagaya recommends sheltering-at-home, 31.9% answered "Yes, I know" and 66.4% answered "No, I do not know".



Awareness of the hazard map

Asked how aware respondents were of the hazard map, 41.4% of them replied "Yes", they had a copy and 31.6% replied "No, but I have seen it", giving the total of 72.9% knew about it. 14.5% replied "No, and I have never seen it, but I have heard of it" and 9.8% "No, and I have never heard of it", giving the total of 24.3% did not know about it.

When respondents were asked if they agreed with the idea that "men should work and women should remain in the home", 13.6% answered "I agree" and 85.4% answered "I disagree."



Awareness of the "Setagaya City Partnership Agreement" initiative


Asked how aware respondents were of the "Setagaya City Partnership Agreement" initiative, the highest response was 55.9% for "I do not know". 12.0% replied "Yes, I know the details" and 30.6% "I have heard of the name of the initiative but I do not know the details", giving the total of 42.6% knew about it.



13. Peace Museum

Awareness of the Setagaya Peace Museum


When respondents were asked if they were aware of the Setagaya Peace Museum, 2.8% said "I have been there", 12.5% "I know of it but have not visited there or seen the exhibitions" and 1.4% "I have seen the exhibitions, such as regional traveling exhibitions, at public facilities, etc."; thus 16.7% of them knew about it, while 82.4% said "I do not know".

• Sufficiency of Setagaya City's initiatives to achieve a society of multicultural coexistence


When respondents were asked if Setagaya City is doing enough to achieve a society of multicultural coexistence, 37.7% said that they did agree that the City's initiative was sufficient and 58.1% said that they did not agree.

Awareness of the cultural and historic assets within Setagaya City


When respondents were asked about their awareness of the cultural and historic assets within Setagaya City, 57.1% said "I have been there" to the public cultural facilities, followed by the historical cultural resources (46.7%) and the private cultural facilities (25.2%). The highest response which they knew about them was the public cultural facilities (87.8%).



16. Sports


Number of times residents exercised or participated in sports over the past year

When respondents were asked how often they have exercised or participated in sports over the past year, the highest response was 22.6% for "I have not engaged in any sports or exercises". Among those who have exercised or participated, "3 times a week or more" (20.6%) was the highest response, followed by "once a week", "2 times a week", and "1 - 3 times a month", etc.


Satisfaction with smoking etiquette in area of residence

Awareness and usage of SETAGAYA Pay


When respondents were asked about their awareness and experience of SETAGAYA Pay, the highest response was "I have heard of SETAGAYA Pay, but I have never used it" (49.5%). 14.1% said "I currently use SETAGAYA Pay (within the past 3 months)", and 6.6% "I have used SETAGAYA Pay in the past, but I have not used it recently (within the past 3 months)"; thus 20.7% of them overall have experience using it.



Awareness of the Setagaya City Public Contract Ordinance















As a general rule, if your home is undamaged in a disaster, you should stay there and use water and food supplies that you have accumulated and stored for you and your family's use (Shelter-at-Home). Sheltering-at-home when possible is an extremely important measure for preventing overcrowding in evacuation centers. The "Setagaya City Flood Hazard Map" has been created to help the city's residents be prepared to protect themselves from flood damage on a daily basis. J-ALERT is a system that enables the Japanese Government to instantly convey emergency information to the people in Japan. Using artificial satellites and terrestrial channels, the National Government conveys information about situations in which there is little time to respond, such as information about ballistic missiles or earthquake early warnings (from the Cabinet Secretariat/Japan Meteorological Agency via the Fire and Disaster Management Agency) through broadcasting using the Disaster Prevention and Administrative Radio System or Emergency Alert e-mails to people's mobile telephones/smartphones.

In the event that J-ALERT sends emergency information to people due to a ballistic missile flying over/falling within the Tokyo Metropolitan Area, you need to take evacuation measures immediately. If you are outside, evacuate immediately to a nearby building or underground. If there are no buildings nearby, take cover next to a large object, lying face-down on the ground and protecting your head. If you are inside, move away from the windows or move to a room without windows.
