

What to do in the event of a traffic accident.



- ① Stop your bike immediately.
- 2 Move your bike to the roadside. Do not block traffic.
- 3 Call an ambulance (dial 119) if someone is injured. Give emergency aid until the ambulance arrives. However, do not try to move the injured person. Call the police (dial 110). Never leave the scene of an accident. You are obliged to explain to


the police how the accident happened.

Let's review traffic rules & manners for bicycles


As a general rule, bicycles travel on the road.

(Bicycles on sidewalks are allowed only as exceptions to the rule) Violation may be subject to: imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen.

A child under 13 years-old
A person at least 70 years old
A person with a physical disability



Travel on the left side of the road

Violation may be subject to: imprisonment of up to 3 months or fine of up to 50,000 yen.

When otherwise unavoidable to ensure your own safety





Pedestrians have the right of way on sidewalks Ride slowly, staying on the side close to the roadway

On the sidewalk, proceed at a speed that can allow you to stop immediately. Stop whenever there is a possibility of blocking pedestrian passage. Violations may be subject to: fine of up to 20,000 yen or a minor fine

Take out insurance in case of a bicycle accident

The Tokyo Metropolitan Government ordinance has been amended, making it mandatory from April 1, 2020 for all those who use bicycles to be insured*.

Take out insurance to cover yourself in case of a bicycle accident.

* Accident insurance for liability coverage in the event of death or bodily injury to a third party caused when using a bicycle
